ECGRA's Youth & Education Impact Area originated in 2014 with the Summer Jobs & More program. This impact category is designed to educate Erie's young adult workforce, strengthen schools and employers, and abate poverty.

In keeping with this commitment, on November 12 The Erie Community Foundation and ECGRA announced their joint investment in four Shaping Tomorrow projects focused on education and training for youth and adults, healthcare for underserved neighborhoods, and character development for inner-city students:

\$400,000 to Erie's Public Schools for Tech After Hours, a workforce development program that will provide in-demand job training and placement to out-of-school youth and displaced adult workers;

\$250,000 to Gannon University for GO College, which prepares Strong Vincent and East high school students to enter a post-secondary institution or branch of the military;

\$200,000 to Primary Health Network to expand school- and neighborhoodbased health centers to two new facilities; and

\$150,000 to All About Character, Inc., a 37-week character-education curriculum taught in Erie city schools by Pennsylvania State Troopers and Erie City Police Officers.

We hope you and yours have a happy holiday season and return to work in 2016 refreshed and ready to do what you do so well - tackle our region's challenges.
