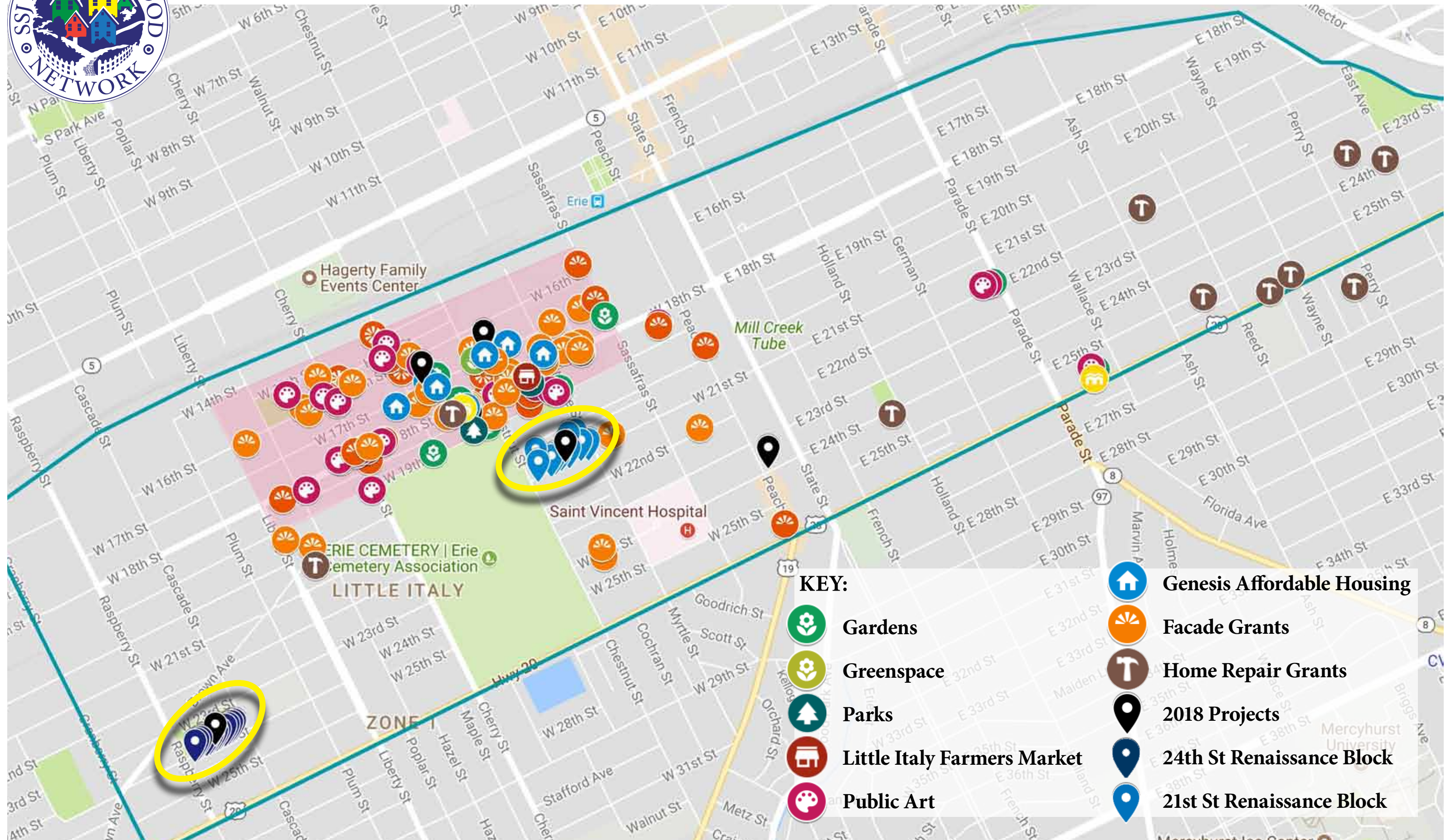

\$50,000 in grants = \$100,000 in revitalization activities

SSJNN 24th Street RBG Grants

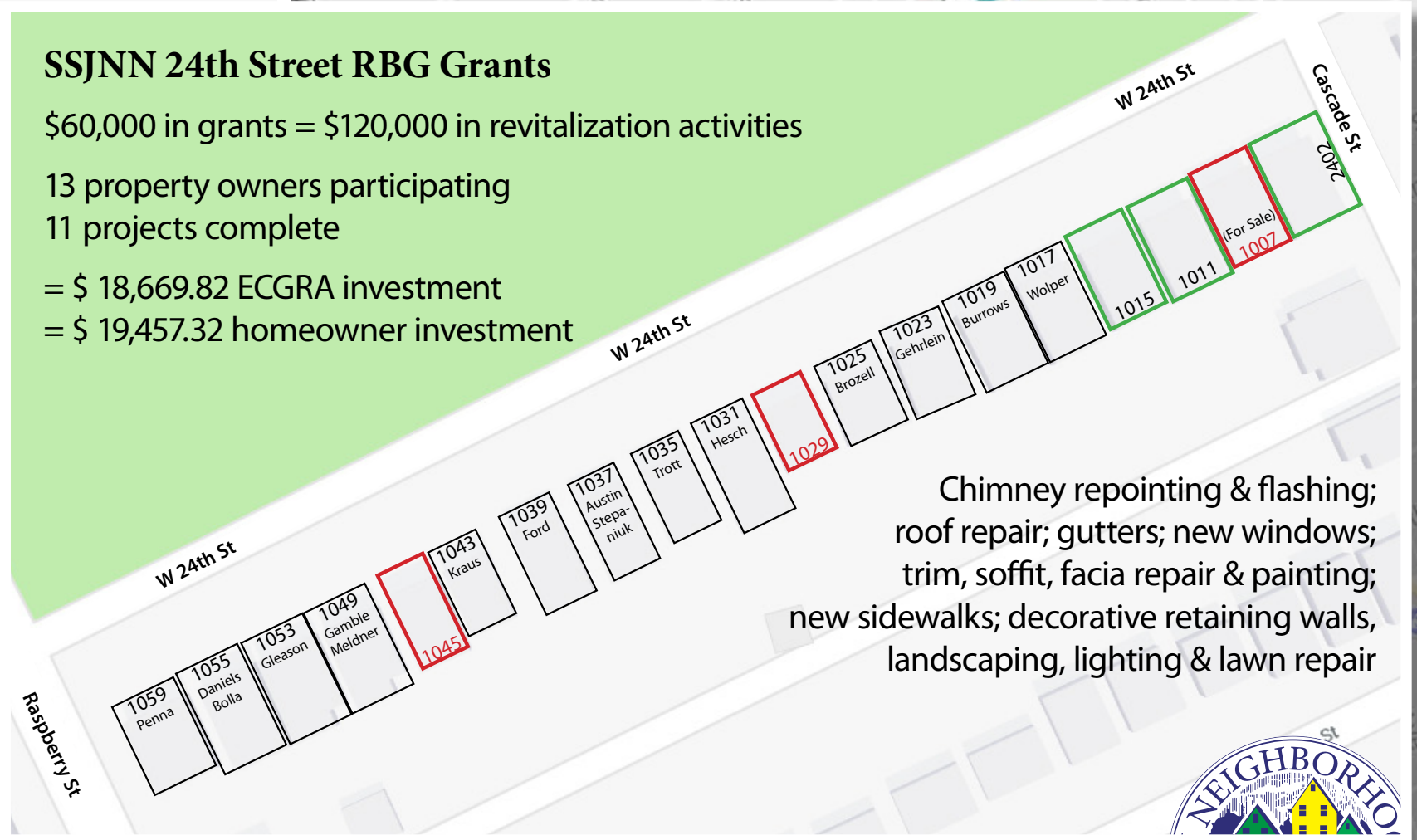
\$60,000 in grants = \$120,000 in revitalization activities

SUPPORTED WORK EXPERIENCE FOR YOUTH

Revitalizing a neighborhood - Empowering its people

Knitting together our highly-supported work experiences for youth with our comprehensive strategy addressing the many community and economic needs of our neighborhoods, the SSJNN Supported Work Experience program will provide 1,886 hours of supported work experience for 30 at-risk youth and 4 adults living within the 7 census tracts of SSJNN's service area.

Youth choose from 1 of 4 job options according to their interests, including: neighborhood beautification, urban farming, bicycle repair, healthcare or retail services.

Funding leveraged: ECGRA, PA DCED Neighborhood Assistance Program, Erie County, Erie Diocese, SSJ of Northwestern PA, TANF — and many private, individual donors
